Public Safety Capital Plan Authorization

Reauthorization of the Public Safety Capital Plan This plan is designed to fund the **specialized equipment needs** for the Rescue, Technical Rescue and Police Departments.

Emergency Services Information

- Rescue: 6 career staff with 35+ volunteers
- Technical Rescue: 40 volunteers
- Marine Patrol: 1 seasonal officer
- Specialized equipment (between three units): over \$670,000

Plan Information

Financial Structure of Plan

- Funding authorization every five years by voters
- Initially authorized by voters in March of 2016
- Revolving Fund: fund can be carried over for larger multiyear projects
- Total funding annually: \$30,750

Public Safety Capital Plan Authorization

- Five years of funding @ \$30,750 annually supports:
 - Town Rescue Squad and 35+ volunteers with equipment including 2 power cots, 2 cardiac monitors/defibrillators, stair chairs, radios worth \$108,000
 - Technical Rescue team of 40 volunteers with radios, Inflatable boat, air packs, air tanks, harnesses, water suits and search camera worth \$62,500

Public Safety Capital Plan Authorization

Why multi-year capital plans instead of funding from the annual General Operating budget?



- Provides consistent funding for capital needs
- Allows deliberate equipment replacement planning
- Increased opportunities to obtain grant funding
- Avoids spikes in taxes
- Pay as you go, vs. debt payments
- Provides funding flexibility across public safety departments based on need in a given fiscal year





Public Safety Capital Plan Authorization er

How much does the Public Safety Capital Plan cost me?

- For the owner of a \$300,000 home, this plan costs approximately \$4.15/yr.
- The previous five years of funding, at a rate of \$18,750 annually, cost the same homeowner approximately \$2.53/yr.

Assessed Value	200,000	300,000	400,000
Annual +/-	\$2.77	\$4.15	\$5.53



Public Safety Capital Plan Authorization

Purpose of proposed increase in funding for this plan:

- The prior authorization didn't include the cost of police boat in 2019 as we had saved enough money and procured enough grants for its replacement five years in advance of the purchase
- This plan's proposed funding now reflects savings towards the two boats which will each have a 25-year replacement cycle.
- This funding also includes savings toward replacement motors which is expected to occur every 5 years for the primary boat and every 10 years for the secondary boat.
