Re: ARPA Funding Requests – Determination of Comprehensive Plan Consistency.

The Town has received over one-hundred funding requests and recommendations from the public, outside organizations, and Town staff and committees for use of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds awarded to the Town. To assist the Town Council with its deliberations on how to allocate the funding, the Planning Board was asked to review the submitted requests and to advise the Town Council on the consistency of each proposal with the goals and policies of the Middletown Comprehensive Community Plan.

During a special meeting held on May 5, 2022 the Planning Board reviewed the 115 project suggestions in order to determine Comprehensive Plan consistency. Please see the attached list of proposals. The last few columns of the table, shaded in gray, provide a short summary description of each request, a link to access the form or other document that was submitted by the requester, and a column indicating Comprehensive Plan consistency. The Board applied one of the following designations to each request:

- "Y" Yes, the requested project is consistent with the goals and policies of the Middletown Comprehensive Community Plan.
- "N" No, the project is not consistent with the Plan. A brief explanation is provided in the Comments column of the table.
- "N/A" This type of project is not addressed in and does not fall within the scope of the Comprehensive Plan.

In making its determinations of Comprehensive Plan consistency, the Board made no judgment as to the worthiness of the projects, and is not providing recommendations as to which projects should be considered by the Town Council for funding.
